



BUNGUNYAH MANOR

History

Emily and Jim Franklin built the original Bungunyah guest house in 1928. Emily was the daughter of Tamborine's first Settlers, the Curtis family. The original guest house is now the Manor House's Restaurant. After 1945, the manor ceased as a guest house and after Emily's death in the 1960s, deterioration kicked in.

The paranormal activity reports seem to have heightened in the following years after a substantial renovation of the old manor.

There have been many reports in the media about Bungunyah's three resident ghosts. Emily (the owner), A young lady in a blue dress (called the bridesmaid) and a little girl who roams through the halls and mainly reported being seen in room's 9 and 10.





API Log

API spent an overnight at Bungunyah Manor in September 2010. With reports of three different spirits haunting the Manor, we had access to room's 9 and 10 (where the spirit of a little girl is seen), The bridal Suite (which has reports of a young female) and limited access to the restaurant (which is the original house) Note: Although Emily's ghost has been witnessed throughout the property most sightings tend to be in the restaurant area (original house).



The Manor houses a Christmas all year round' theme and is a beautiful building with a strange, but welcoming feel to it.



Findings

Room 9

No EVP recordings although after reviewing our locked off a camera overnight, interestingly at 4.20am the K2 starts spiking.

Room 10

No anomalous readings or EVP recordings

Bridal suite

No footage or EVP's recorded.

Restaurant

We had limited time in the restaurant unlike our access to the rest of the manor. In the short time we were there, we experienced multiple spikes on our K2 meters, primarily front of house area near the fireplace.

Conclusion

This was definitely an interesting property. Although nothing was caught on audio or recording (apart from the K2 spiking), there were enough coincidences throughout the evening that warrants another investigation.

We would definitely like to spend more time investigating the restaurant area.
