



WOLSTON HOUSE

History:

In 1852, Dr Stephen Simpson, one of Queensland's early settlers, built the original brick and timber structure which we know as Wolston House. In the years to come, the building was subsequently extended by the Goggs family and then later by the Grindle and Hurley families.

Wolston house was saved from demolition in the 1960's by a small band of Brisbane residents, and given to the newly created National Trust by the Queensland Government.

There has been a fair share of hardship and death stories surrounding Wolston House. The home is a rectangle shape, only one room wide with a wide veranda giving access to each room. There is an old dairy underneath.



API Log:

Wolston House has been mentioned time and time again in the paranormal respect. Being named one of Brisbane's haunted hot spots.

The constant mention of Wolston house in the local news articles and word of mouth was the reason for API's interest. We conducted an investigation at the old farmhouse in October 2010.
